<b>Course Content:</b>	<p><b>Learning Aims &amp; Objectives Level 1 Safeguarding Adults at Risk</b></p> <p>This Level 1 Adult Safeguarding course provides delegates with the knowledge and skills required to safeguard adults. It describes the types of abuse, how to recognise them, and how to respond to concerns. It also explains how to correctly report concerns.</p> <p>By the end of the course delegates will be able to:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>▪ Demonstrate knowledge of the definition of ‘An adult at risk’.</li> <li>▪ Demonstrate the signs and symptoms of different types of adult abuse.</li> <li>▪ Demonstrate an understanding of how, and why, we work with other agencies to safeguard adults at risk.</li> <li>▪ Explain what to do if you have safeguarding concerns about an adult, a colleague, or practices within an organisation.</li> <li>▪ Explore the barriers to disclosure of abuse.</li> <li>▪ Examine values and attitudes in relation to adult abuse.</li> <li>▪ Demonstrate an understanding of adult safeguarding processes.</li> <li>▪ Have an understanding of the law and local Safeguarding procedures and principles including ‘Capacity &amp; Consent’.</li> </ul>
